Anniversary of the Battle of Franklin commemorated with battlefield walking tours, cellar tour and blood drive

Civil War historians Thomas Y. Cartwright and Jamie Gillum will conduct a battlefield walking tour on Saturday, Nov. 26 to commemorate the Battle of Franklin held on Nov. 30, 1864. Cartwright will also host a walking tour on Nov. 30.

"What better way to commemorate the Battle of Franklin than to walk the battlefield with two of Franklin's most renowned historians Thomas and Jamie," said Lotz House Executive Director J.T. Thompson." This duo will recreate the dramatic conflict that killed or wounded 10,000 soldiers right in the heart of Franklin where the Lotz House was at ground zero. I

Jamie Gillum wrote a 3 volume history on the Sixteenth Tennessee Volunteer Infantry Regiment. Most recently he completed a study on the Battle of Spring Hill, entitled: "Twenty-five Hours to Tragedy" that helps reconstruct Battle of Franklin. The tour with Cartwright and Gillum is Saturday, Nov. 26 from 10 a.m. – noon and costs \$30 per person. Cartwright's second tour will be Nov. 30 from 10 a.m. – noon.
